Teen driving stats.

For young teen drivers, distracted driving can be fatal. Know and understand distracted teen driving stats as motivation to stay focused behind the wheel.

3,058

young drivers (age 13-19) died in motor vehicle crashes in 2021.1

5,037


young drivers (ages 15-20) were involved in fatal motor vehicle crashes.1

teenagers killed in crashes in 2021 were males.1



of fatal crashes among drivers (age 15-19) involved alcohol use.²





Teen driving risk factors.

Teens and young drivers are more at risk to get into car accidents than adults.

Check out some common risk factors:



New found freedom and peer pressure can increase the risk of drinking and driving among teens.

Drinking



Texting

38% of teens have admitted to texting while driving.



Not using seat belts

Teen drivers are less likely to buckle up on the road.



Inexperience

Teens are more likely than older drivers to underestimate or not be able to recognize dangerous situations.



Nighttime driving

40% of fatal crashes among teens aged 13–19 occurred between 9 p.m. and 6 a.m ^{1,4}



Using drugs/substances

About 13% of U.S. high school students drove when they had been using marijuana.⁵

Set your phone to while driving.


> Call for a ride if you cannot drive.
